

Grades 3-4 Humanities

- ___ pencils & sharpener
- ___ 8+ pack of colored pencils
- ___ thin (1") binder for worksheets/handouts
- ___ ring or mini-binder for memory cards
- ___ dividers (5 will be plenty)
- ___ pencils
- ___ pack of 3X5 cards
- ___ 3 composition books
 - 1 to use as a copybook
 - 1 for history narrations
 - 1 for spelling tests and grammar exercises
- ___ whiteboard (8.5 X 11 or 9X12 – small enough to fit in backpack is best) (does NOT need to be magnetic)
- ___ 1 dry-erase marker or crayon (any type or color)
- ___ sketchbook ***Grade 4: you may continue using last year's sketchbook.**

Grade 5/6 Humanities

- ___ 1.5" binder with 5 dividers: Admin, History*, Bible, Literature, Geography*
- ___ 1" binder (can be the flexible type) or 3-ring folder for Composition, with 6 dividers.
- ___ notebook paper
- ___ an inexpensive spiral-bound sketchbook (5 ½ X 8 ½) (no minimum paper weight)
- ___ good quality colored pencils and/or markers, at least 12 colors. (Don't have to have both.)
- ___ pencils w/ erasers, sharpener
- ___ ruler (6" size is fine)
- ___ 3 X 5 cards
- ___ scissors
- ___ glue stick
- ___ 2 composition books (one for Grammar, one for Copywork)
- ___ for use at home: a dictionary (unabridged) with good etymological information
