

**Middle School Humanities**

- \_\_\_ a 2 or 2.5" three- ring binder  
(or two 1.5" binders: one for History/Bible and one for English/Logic)
- \_\_\_ Lots of loose leaf paper
- \_\_\_ dividers labeled as follows: Latin, Grammar, Composition, Bible, History, Logic, Literature  
(You may want to sub-divide your sections into "Notes" and "Exercises" using post-it tabs.)
- \_\_\_ Pens, pencils, colored pencils, highlighters
- \_\_\_ 2+ spiral bound or composition notebooks for History/Bible
- \_\_\_ 1 composition notebook or nicely bound journal for your Commonplace Book (Literature)  
(Choose something that will last the duration of your high school career.)
- \_\_\_ Preferably an ESV translation of the Bible  
(You can find nice inexpensive ones on Amazon)
- \_\_\_ for use at home: a thesaurus & a dictionary (unabridged) with good etymological information
